

Garland assembly.

Note: Make sure to put the flowers in water first thing. They'll be thirsty from their long journey.

For this installation, you'll need the following materials:

- Floral scissors or pruning shears
- Floral water tubes
- Buckets of water (1 for greenery and 1 for premium and filler flowers)
- Pitcher of water or syringe to refill water tubes

Flower care tips for a long-lasting garland:

- Carefully unwrap provided bouquets.
 - Add floral food that arrived with flowers.
 - Cut stems at a 45-degree angle.
 - Always keep flowers cool and out of direct sunlight.
1. Begin by preparing water buckets and trimming 1/2 to 1 inch off each stem. You'll also want to separate your greenery bunches from premium roses and filler flowers. Be sure to place them in your water buckets to keep them hydrated.
 2. Place 2 bunches together in line and the other 2 in the opposite direction. Use extra stems to cover the joints.
 3. Add flowers to the garland, keeping the same proportions on each side.
 4. Fill the tubes with water (prepared with flower food) to keep the flowers hydrated. Insert the most sensitive blooms, such as garden roses, last.
